Dear Huron Park Families,

The Simcoe Muskoka District Health Unit has issued a health fax to advise that the Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA) has issued a food recall warning for Neilson® brand partly skimmed chocolate milk due to the possibility of it containing *Listeria monocytogenes*.

This recall applies to Neilson® brand partly skimmed chocolate milk manufactured by the Saputo® Georgetown, Ontario facility (plant registration # 1590). The plant registration number "1590" that appears on packages can assist consumers in identifying the affected products.

The Simcoe Muskoka District Health Unit has requested the Simcoe County District School Board's assistance to inform anyone who may have consumed the product to monitor themselves for signs and symptoms of listeriosis and seek medical attention if any symptoms are experienced.

Food contaminated with *Listeria monocytogenes* may not look or smell spoiled but can still make you sick. Symptoms of listeriosis can include diarrhea, vomiting, nausea, persistent fever, muscle aches, severe headache and neck stiffness. Pregnant women, the elderly and people with weakened immune systems are particularly at risk. Although infected pregnant women may experience only mild, flu-like symptoms, the infection can lead to premature delivery, infection of the newborn or even stillbirth. In rare instances, severe illness may result in death.

We have checked the milk available through our school. Some of our milk is included in the recall. Milk included in the recall may have been consumed by students before the recall was issued.

If you think you or your child became sick from eating or drinking a recalled product, call your doctor. Check to see if you have recalled products in your home. Recalled products should be thrown out or returned to the store where they were purchased.
